Attendance: We are seeing a large number of holiday requests this term. Please be advised that we do not authorise any term time holidays and we will report any to the Educational Entitlement Service and you may incur a fine. Within the school day, the children have access to so much learning that missing a week of school will have a detrimental effect on your child's education. Phonics and Maths are fast pace lessons with an end goal, missing these lessons regularly could cause your child to fall behind in their learning. We expect every child to reach 97% attendance at the end of the year.

FoM Quiz Night: This is the first FoM quiz night hosted by the Swan and Helmet public house on Grove Road. We hope to see as many of you there as possible – a time to socialise without the children! We hope everyone has received a flyer and booking form for the Quiz night to raise money for Friends of MAPS. Please note there is an early booking discount of £18 per team or £20 on the night. If you would like to attend the quiz but don't have a full team of 4, please give your name to the school office and we will put teams together. As we make teams of 4, you will be contacted to let you know so you are able to pay your share of the entry fee.

Special Pebbles: Last term, we totalled a massive 14677 Special pebbles throughout the school.
