In school we will be:

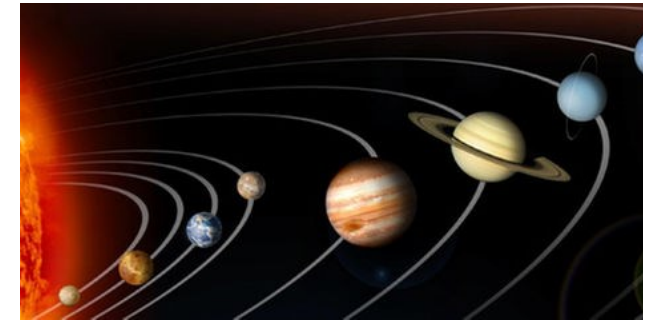
- Focussing on independence in all aspects of learning, including concentrating during lesson times, talking through disagreements on the playground, and getting changed for PE and being responsible for our own belongings

Key learning for this term:

- Science—learning about the properties of materials.
- Writing— learning to write a poem about a journey to space. We will be continuing to learn about using punctuation correctly and focussing on handwriting.
- Maths—continuing to develop our place value skills; length and measure and extending our learning about money.
- Geography—learning about the continents and oceans.

At home you can help by:

- Listening to your child read their Read-Write Inc books and recording this in their reading diary. Share school library books and any other books together. 5 or more reads at home earns a special pebble.
- Asking them questions about the stories you have shared at home.
- Completing your child's home learning activity and talking to them about what they have been learning in school.
- Promoting independence and encouraging your child to organise and dress themselves.
